

You could attach string to make a mouth open and close. To do this, you'll need to attach string to a bottom jaw which you control by pulling strings over you shouders.


## Let's get creative!

Grab your cardboard backpack and let's go wild! Now is the time to bring everything together and create your very own play backpack.




Check back to your invention sheet for some inspiration!



Make a slide by adding carboard panels to the base of the backpack. Tape together so they fold up concertina-style. Experiment with width and length.




Soar through the sky by adding wings. You could usecardboard or create a witeframe using coat hangers.




Grab some plastic bottles and make your own rocket boosters!
